Intermediate // Advanced



At Intermediate level, apprentices will play an important role in supporting pupils, parents and colleagues to make sure that pupils get the most out of their lessons. This Apprenticeship is designed to help you develop the knowledge and skills required to effectively support teaching and learning. At Advanced level, it is anticipated that you will have some responsibility in your role and that you will contribute to the planning, implementation and evaluation of a wide range of learning activities.

What qualifications, experience or skills do I need?

At Intermediate level, work experience is advantageous but not essential, whilst the Advanced Apprenticeship is ideally suited to individuals who have achieved the Intermediate Apprenticeship. You will be expected to be a positive role model to children and young people and as a result you should demonstrate a positive and professional attitude at all times. Effective communication skills and good ICT skills are also essential and asked for by employers when recruiting.

What is the expected duration?

Intermediate – 12 months minimum

Advanced – 18 months

How will I be assessed?

You will be assessed in the workplace through observations, witness testimonies and personal statements, overseen by an Assessor. This information will be incorporated into an e-portfolio giving evidence of competency in your job role.

Progression from this Apprenticeship and future prospects

When you achieve the Intermediate Apprenticeship you can further develop the skills you need to support teaching and learning effectively by progressing to study the Advanced Apprenticeship. Upon completion of the Advanced Apprenticeship, you can choose to pursue a Foundation Degree in Teaching and other higher level teaching assistant training.
